



## **Growing reach across Muskoka**



### Our Reach – 2017 Summer Results

# We touch thousands of Residents, Boaters and Cottagers through our Partners and our participation at events:

- Total of almost 100 Boaters Code Signs installed since 2013
- Distributed over 15,000 Code Cards and over 1800 ROW's
- 16 Boating events & AGM's, visited 32 marinas & 10 resorts
- In touch with over 75 lake associations.
- 752 new survey respondents asked to be added to our email list
- Newsletter open rate over 50% circulation list over 2,000
- Social media presence growing ~500 Twitter followers
- 25 traditional media stories
