

We are undertaking an ambitious joint media campaign with the OPP on education/outreach to raise awareness of boating safety and excessive boat noise, and how owners can mitigate the noise.

The Quiet Campaign launch was on Saturday May 21 (Victoria Day weekend) at Port Carling. It included ride-along in an OPP patrol boat as officers inspected boats along the Indian River. OPP Partnership for Summer 2016

The OPP marine patrol's main focus on the water is education, Sergeant Todd Selvage from the Bracebridge Detachment told the SQL stakeholders' meeting. Enforcement comes second.

The top priorities are life jackets, speeding, and the use of alcohol. If there's a violation in any of those areas, there is no discretion allowed.



Breakout Sessions & Participant Feedback

Following the presentations we had a freewheeling Q&A session with OPP representatives and speakers.

The meeting concluded with six breakout sessions which gave participants the opportunity to provide input to SQL strategic direction, tactics and plans.


2015 Strong year - Plans for 2016 Boaters Always Care
